

At the workshop of the Town Board of the Town of Elmira, Chemung County, New York held Tuesday, May 9, 2023 at 7:00pm at 1255 West Water Street, Elmira, NY, there were present:

Supervisor Gerould called the workshop to order at 7:00pm and lead attendees in the Pledge of Allegiance

Supervisor Gerould stated she would like to add Pickleball under discussion to the agenda for tonight's meeting

Supervisor Gerould introduced Christine Cook who attended the meeting to discuss the WINK foundation. Mrs. Cook spoke with the board regarding a Cancer walk that the foundation would like to hold in the Town of Elmira in the Fall of 2024. The board agreed to discuss this further with the foundation when more information comes available in the planning process.

### **Discussion**

Supervisor Gerould asked Town Clerk Stein to speak regarding the Tennis courts as she has been in communication with the Company. Town Clerk Stein stated that she spoke with Mr. Duffy from Super Seal Sealcoating Company and did the appropriate paperwork needed. Mr. Duffy is looking into doing the project in August or after the tournaments in September. He and Town Clerk Stein will communicate in the upcoming month to have specific dates the courts will be once Mr. Duffy finalizes a few things on his end.

Supervisor Gerould and the board spoke regarding the basketball courts. They decided that at this time no further action will be taken. The board asked that more data be collected regarding the usage of the courts and this will be revisited at a later date. The board discussed the comments from the April 17<sup>th</sup> meeting and discussed a possible task force utilizing those that stated they'd be willing to help with upkeep costs, pick up and other ways. This will be discussed further at a later date.

Attorney Moore spoke stating that he attended a solar workshop and that he and code enforcement officer Crandall will be working to update an ordinance regarding solar fields.

Councilmember Lucarelli spoke in regards to a complaint he received with people using the tennis courts to play pickleball. The board also spoke regarding a complaint from a Morningside resident regarding the pickleball court noise.
